Be God's Instrument

In Mark chapter 6, a huge crowd gathered to listen to Jesus. It was late in the day, and the disciples got nervous and started asking Jesus to dismiss the crowds so they can find food to eat. Jesus replied, "You give them something to eat." It's easy to miss those words from Jesus.

Why would Jesus say that? Did He want to see if they would trust Him to perform a miracle? Maybe, but it seems more likely He wanted His disciples more involved in caring for the crowd. He wanted His disciples to be more hands on in working with and for Jesus. He then blessed the five loaves and two fish and performed the miracle of feeding the five thousand.

I think Jesus uses those words with us, too. When a need presents itself in the lives of those around us, we need to bring it to the Lord in prayer. I am sure Jesus answers our prayers by saying, "You do something!" Our response may be, "we don't have enough money, time or energy to complete the task." We're wrong of course. When Jesus asks us to get involved, He already knows how He will accomplish His work through us.

What we need is faith and the vision to see that God wants us to be His instruments, and that He will supply what we need. God uses us as instruments to help someone in need. May we use this Easter season to gain the courage to follow His lead!


