



Meditation

Some Christians get a little skeptical when you start talking about meditation. There is a difference between scriptural meditation and some types of mystical meditation. According to one explanation mystical meditation is when the rational mind moves into neutral so that the psyche can take over. The focus is inward, and the aim is to become one with creation and its Creator.

When we engage in a scriptural mediation, we focus on the things of our Lord and its purpose is to renew our minds so that we think and act like Christ. Its objective is to reflect on what God has said and done and what God is like. We pray that while we meditate on scripture, our words will be acceptable to the Lord. We need to fill our minds with scripture and reflect on God's love, His deeds, His promises and goodness.

We need to remember that whatever is true, noble, just, pure, holy, and anything that is praiseworthy, these are some of the things we should meditate on. To become more like Christ, reflect on who He is in our lives!

BBQ/Grilling Safety

Each year hundreds of gas grill fires/explosions occur nationally as well as dozens of deaths from carbon monoxide.

- 1) Grill must be outside & placed at least 10 feet from house, and other combustibles.
- 2) Have a fire extinguisher & garden hose handy.
- 3) Before starting grill check for leaks and cracks in hoses.
- 4) Never leave grill unattended.
- 5) Always turn LP gas off first and then the grill when finished.

HOSPITAL VISITATION

WHEN BEING ADMITTED to the hospital, Catholic patients need to inform the admitting staff of their religious affiliation and if a visit from the parish is desired. Due to federal regulations, if patients do not inform the admitting staff, the church will not know of their hospital stay.




