

HOSPITAL VISITATION

WHEN BEING ADMITTED to the hospital, Catholic patients need to inform the admitting staff of their religious affiliation and if a visit from the parish is desired. Due to federal regulations, if patients do not inform the admitting staff, the church will not know of their hospital stay.

Patients can always call the church directly if a visit is desired or sacrament of the sick is needed. Religious affiliation information is not normally obtained from patients who enter the hospital through the emergency room.
