This Task Force was made up of members of the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, School Administration, Staff Members, and other various advisors to the Pastor. When finished, the Task Force created the 2019 Strategic Plan and submitted it to the Parish Pastoral Council for ratification and signature. Its pews will be filled, if I help fill them.


It will do great work, if I work.

STEWARDSHIP: CHOICES I MAKE WITH MY TIME

"Lord, quiet my soul so that I can spend time with you in Prayer"

God has gifted each of us with 24 hours in each day. It is important to effectively manage those hours. We should balance the hours we spend at work, with our families, in prayer, in recreation, and in service to God. Each of these commitments is important and we must ask ourselves: Do we spend quality time with our family? Do we spend an appropriate portion of our time utilizing our talents for the good of others in our parish and community? Most importantly do we spend meaningful time in prayer each day?

"Prayer can include personal and family prayer, reading Scripture, visits to the Blessed Sacrament and attendance at Mass during the week whenever possible." "From the U.S. Bishops Pastoral Letter on Stewardship." Listed on your commitment card are some suggestions for spending time with God in prayer.

STEWARDSHIP: CHOICES I MAKE WITH MY TALENTS

"Go in peace to love and serve The Lord."

As we listen to these words at the end of Mass, we are reminded that a good steward is one who responds to the love of God in many ways. At St. Patrick Parish we have many ways to put these words into practice. Part of being an active member of our parish is to contribute our talents in many places and situations where they can best be put to use. Part of being a welcoming community is being open to the talents of each member. This is why each year we invite all parishioners to make commitments of their talents. Your gift of your talents is what makes St. Patrick a vibrant parish community.

STEWARDSHIP: CHOICES I MAKE WITH MY TREASURE

At St. Patrick, we encourage each other to be better stewards of our money, setting aside a generous offering to the parish each week. This is an important part of our Stewardship Renewal. Each of us has the responsibility, and the inherent desire, to help others in need and to support the ministry of our parish, as well as other worthwhile charitable organizations. All of us have different levels of material resources, but we are all called to return in thanksgiving a proportionate gift, each in a measure with which we have been blessed.

Why give a percentage? Why should we determine the amount of our gift based on a percentage of income? First, because the tithe (10%) is a scriptural benchmark which the Church has honored for centuries (see Malachi 3:10). Secondly, we give a percentage of income because it is a common-sense standard by which everyone can equitably support the parish, each according to his or her ability.

As a parish, St. Patrick breaks down the tithe as follows:

5% to the parish, 1% to the archdiocese and 4% to other charities.

Planned Giving For St. Patrick Parish

Please remember St. Patrick Church, the school or a parish ministry in your will or trust. More than 90% of planned gifts are simple bequests. Examples of these range from a small cash contribution provided through a simple bequest to a larger stock gift used to establish a charitable trust. Children's Faith Formation

The goal of our Religious Education Program is to provide quality catechesis and preparation for receiving the sacraments to our parish elementary and middle school students who do not attend Catholic schools. Catechists (teachers) are dedicated to helping students understand their Catholic faith, preparing them for the Sacraments, engaging them in various ministerial roles by participation in liturgical celebrations, and encouraging them to become active members of the parish community.
